
ORDER ADOPTING AMENDMENTS TO THE RULES FOR
FEES AND COSTS FOR CIRCUIT COURTS

The Board of Judicial Policy and Administration, upon its own motion, has determined that amendments to the Rules for Fees and Costs for Circuit Courts are necessary. It is therefore

ORDERED that the amendments to the Rules for Fees and Costs for Circuit Courts, a copy of which is attached hereto, are adopted and that those amendments be published in the advance sheets of the Pacific Reporter and in the Wyoming Reporter. The amendments shall be effective November 1, 2001, and thereafter shall be spread at length upon the journal of this Court.

RULE 2. FEE FOR RECORDS CHECK

The fee for checking a circuit court records shall be five dollars (\$5.00). All requests for a records check shall be submitted in writing by the applicant. No charge shall be made for checking circuit court records if requested by an employee or representative of a governmental agency. Nor shall any charge be made by the court for responding to inquiries for information from the general public, including representatives from the news media.

Response to the request for a records check shall be made by the circuit court in writing within two (2) days after the written request is submitted to the court. Payment of the \$5.00 fee for each records check shall be made in cash or check payable to the circuit court.

This rule and the charge provided only applies to services required from court personnel to check and/or abstract court records. The rule has no application to the personal examination of any court records including indexes by any individual desiring information from these public records.
